## HOW FIRE SAFE IS YOUR HOUSE? Can You Pass This Brief Test?

- 1. Have you created a minimum 30-foot "defensible space" around your home to allow firefighters to defend your home in the event of a wildfire? (Establishing a defensible space means clearing all flammable plant material away from your home to protect it and to give firefighters a safer area to defend it against wildfire)
- 2. Does your home have a fire resistant roof? (A fire resistant roof is made of non combustible material such as various asphaltic products, ceramic tile or metal)
- 3. Are the undersides of decks and balconies made of fire resistant materials or sealed off to help stop sparks and embers from starting a fire under your deck?
- 4. Are dead branches removed from your home's roof and around the chimney?
- 5. Is your home easily identifiable and accessible from a main road?
- 6. Are all the trees on or near your property:
  - Planted away from overhead utility lines?
  - Pruned back 10 feet from your roof and 15 feet from any chimney?
  - Pruned of their lower branches within six feet of the ground to keep fire from moving from the ground into the trees?
  - More than 15 feet apart?
- 7. If your home is on a slope is the defensible space increased on the downhill side?
- 8. Is firewood stacked at least 15 feet from buildings?
- 9. Are grass and weeds mowed and is vegetation well watered?
- 10. Have you disposed of all the slash, clippings, dead leaves, needles, dead limbs, and other ground litter left from thinning?
- 11. Do you have an evacuation plan for your family prepared and practiced?
- 12. Do you have an emergency water supply with a gasoline powered pump in case electricity is cut off?
- 13. If you have a well, do you have a gasoline powered electrical generator for the well pump?
